## How To Put Together an Art Portfolio

Include your best works. Your portfolio profiles your versatility and indicates the kind of art works you have done. 1 $\qquad$ Your portfolio should accurately represent you. It should be clean and organized.
Use high-quality materials. Your portfolio should look better, from the paper where you paste you sample works to the carrying case where you put everything together.
Offer variations. Don't simply collate all your favorite pieces. 2
Bear in mind that some of your stronger pieces may not really be on the top of your listing.
Ask for your mentor's opinion. He can fairly give you an idea of your strengths and weaknesses as an artist. 3 $\qquad$ He can even give you insights on how to discuss your point-of-view and your approach.

Feature your original works in excellent condition. Whether you are into photography, graphic design, or fine art, the viewer needs to see your output in perfect form.

Sequence your materials. 5 $\qquad$ So, arrange them to do just that. Also, the viewer should go smoothly from piece to piece. His turn to the next page should be effortless.
Go for great "bookends". "Bookends" are supposed to hold your artwork together. That means, you should start your collection with a strong piece and end it with another strong piece. Literally, place your impressive works at the beginning and in the end of your portfolio. 6

Show some brandings. Aside from putting together your pieces, you also need to incorporate in your portfolio your resume, your business card, and your letterhead.
7. $\qquad$ In the art industry, your body of works tells much about your ability, credibility, and reputation. Your well-written resume, detailing your credentials and projects, may not really do the trick just right.
