The impounding of Maneka Gandhi's Passport

The Maneka Gandhi case arose in the period immediately following the end of the national Emergency in India, with the Janta Party government assuming the power in 1977. Maneka Gandhi, daughter-in-law of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi and founder-editor of a political magazine Surya, was issued a passport in 1976 under Passports Act. Soon after the Congress Party was ousted by the Janta Party, she began using Surya as a political platform to restore the image of the Congress Party and discredit leaders of the new government. (The most notable instance of this given was when Surya carried photographs showing the son of then defense minister Jagjivan Ram engaging in sexual intercourse with a student of Delhi university.) In 1977, around the time she wished to visit India to fulfil a speaking engagement, Maneka Gandhi received a letter stating that the Government of India had decided to impound her passport 'in public interest' under section 10(3)© of the Passport Act. The government turned down her request seeking the reasons why the order had been passed, stating that it was not 'in the interest of general public'. In reaction, she filed a writ petition in the Supreme Court challenging the passport impounding order of the Government of India and its subsequent refusal to provide reasons for the same.
